SPORTS CLUB

- The **Annual Sports Meet** was organized by the Sports Club on 12th -13th March, 2024 at the college campus. The events for the two day sports meet were badminton, Table-Tennis, Futsal, Volleyball, Tug of War and e-Football. The first day of the meet had qualifying matches of all the events and the final matches were held on 13th March 2024 followed by the distribution of prizes to all the winner and runner's up felicitated.

ECO CLUB

- Under the mission "KhadiMahotsav" launched by Government of India with the tag line "Khadi for Nation: Khadi for Fashion" and as per the guidelines received from NCTE HQ, New Delhi, the Eco club of Sikkim Government B.Ed. College conducted a fashion walk on Khadi attire on 30th October 2023 to promote khadi handloom, handicraft, village industries and also to foster "AtmaNirbhar Bharat Abhiyan". This fashion walk was done with high enthusiasm by the trainees of this very college in which various forms of khadi attire and articles like handbag, dupatta, etc. were showcased and well flaunted by the trainees. Along with fashion walk, a very meaningful and awakening delivery in the form of speech was shared by our 3rd semester trainee Mr. ReshapRasaily. Mr. ReshapRasaily highlighted on important aspects of Khadi Handicrafts, its origin and Handloom Industry. He further motivated and stressed on promoting One District One Product and the local products to make AtmaNirbhar Bharat Abhiyan of Government of India a grand success.
- With the objective to instil a deep appreciation for the environment among the members of the Eco Club, a hiking trip to Gorkhey and Samanden, Darjeeling District, West Bengal was organized. Through first-hand experience and immersion in nature, students were encouraged to understand the importance of preserving our natural resources and protecting biodiversity. Trekking through the picturesque landscapes and navigating challenges together fostered a sense of camaraderie among participants. This shared experience strengthened their connections and highlighted the importance of teamwork in achieving common goals. The journey commenced from the college gate at 6.30 am with a scenic bus ride, provided by SNT, to the destination with a total of 42 eco club members along with Assistant Professors, Miss Anjali Chettri, Miss TashiOngmuBhutia and Miss PassangDikiBhutia. Gorkhey and Samanden known for its lush greenery and serene ambiance provided the perfect backdrop for our eco-centric expedition. As the day came to an end of our journey, we sat for a hearty meal at Thakali Restaurant

- located at Soreng bazaar accompanied by all the trainees, assistant professors and the bus drivers. The journey ended with all the members bidding farewell to each other.
- On 23rd May 2024, the Eco Club participated in a one-day online orientation on waste auditing, conducted by The Himalayan Clean-up. The session aimed to educate attendees on effective waste management practices, with a focus on plastic segregation, understanding plastic grades, proper disposal methods, and the use of the Kobo Collect app for waste data collection. The sessions Highlighted
 - a. Plastic Segregation: The importance of segregating different types of plastics was emphasized to ensure proper recycling and disposal. Participants learned about common types of plastics found in waste and their respective categories and the techniques for identifying and separating various plastic items were demonstrated.
 - b. Understanding Plastic Grades:Detailed explanations were provided on the seven types of plastic resins identified by the Resin Identification Code (RIC).
 - Type 1: PET (Polyethylene Terephthalate)
 - Type 2: HDPE (High-Density Polyethylene)
 - Type 3: PVC (Polyvinyl Chloride)
 - Type 4: LDPE (Low-Density Polyethylene)
 - Type 5: PP (Polypropylene)
 - Type 6: PS (Polystyrene)
 - Type 7: Other (various other plastics)
 - The session covered the properties, common uses, and recyclability of each plastic type.
 - c. Proper Disposal Methods:Instructions on how to dispose of various types of waste materials were provided. Emphasis was placed on the importance of reducing, reusing, and recycling to minimize environmental impact. Participants were encouraged to adopt sustainable practices in their daily lives to reduce waste generation.
 - d. Use of Kobo Collect App: The Kobo Collect app was introduced as a tool for data collection during waste audits. A step-by-step guide on how to use the app was provided, including: Setting up the app and creating surveys. Collecting and recording data on different types of

waste. Participants practiced using the app to count and categorize waste items.

The online orientation conducted by The Himalayan Clean-up was a comprehensive session that equipped the Eco Club members of Govt. B.Ed. College Soreng with valuable knowledge and skills in waste auditing. The training on plastic segregation, understanding plastic grades, proper disposal methods, and the use of the Kobo Collect app will empower participants to conduct effective waste audits and contribute to environmental conservation efforts. The Eco Club members expressed their gratitude for the informative session and committed to applying the knowledge gained in their future activities to promote sustainable waste management practices within their community.

• The observance of World Environment Day on 5th June, 2024 at college premises was meticulously planned by the *Eco Club in collaboration with NSS Cell*to ensure the maximum utilization of resources and active participation of all members. The event began with the allocation of land to various houses for plantation and cleanliness drives. This strategic allocation aimed at promoting a sense of responsibility and teamwork among the participants. The Houses were assigned specific areas. These assignments ensured a systematic approach to the activities, allowing each house to contribute effectively to the land restoration efforts. A key highlight of the day's activities was the plantation drive. The activity not only beautified the college premises but also served as a practical step towards land restoration. Parallel to the plantation drive, a cleanliness drive was conducted to address the issue of waste management. Under the guidance of Masters from each house, participants collected waste from different parts of the campus. The waste was then stratified into different types, including plastics, to facilitate proper disposal and recycling. NSS CLUB

• On 8th May, 2024, this college under NSS banner and in collaboration with Red Ribbon Club, organized aBlood Donation Camp at Sikkim Govt. B.Ed. College, Soreng District. The drive was supported by the Sikkim State AIDS Control Society (SSACS), Gangtok. The event aimed at contributing to the noble cause of saving lives through voluntary blood donation. The event witnessed overwhelming and enthusiastic

participants with over one hundred donors generously contributing to the initiative. The volunteers of both the team of NSS Cell and Red Ribbon Club played a crucial role in mobilizing resources, raising awareness and ensuring the successful of the event. The drive attracted a significant numbers of volunteers, including Principal Madam, Dean of Student Affairs, faculty members, administrative staffs, local community members, police personnel, and teacher trainees from boththe semesters (II and IV). - On 28th August, 2024, an **Awareness Programme on TB and HIV** was organized by the District TB Centre Gyalshing, Health & Family Welfare Department Govt. Of Sikkim and HIV & AIDS Control Society, Soreng Branch in collaboration with NSS CELL, of this institute. The primary objective of this programme was to educate and create awareness about the causes, symptoms, prevention and treatment of these diseases. ART & CRAFT CLUB

• In collaboration with NSS Club, the Art & Craft Club organized a 'One Day Workshop on Terracotta' on 11th July 2024 was organized. The master trainer was Mr. SewonRai, Asst. Professor, Fine Arts. The session began with short welcome note and brief introduction of master trainer by Dr. AnmikaGurung, Asst. Prof. and also the member of Art & Craft Club. The session was also briefed by Mr. Budha Hang Subba, Programme Officer. The master trainer Mr. SewonRaistarted with the introduction and conceptualized the term 'Terracotta', its origin and historical background. The following

techniques were involved in creating terracotta objects from the initial stages to the final product- sourcing and preparing the clay, preparation, shaping the clay, drying the finished product.

PLACEMENT CELL

The Placement Cell, in collaboration with the Alumni Cell, organized a Mock Interview session for the final year college students of B.Ed. College, (4th Semester). The initiative aimed to prepare students for real-world job interviews, enhancing their confidence and interview skills.
